When Peter came to Antioch, Paul withstood him to the face, because he was to be blamed. He wrote, "I saw that they walked not uprightly according to the truth of the gospel" (Gal. 2:14). If Paul had acquiesced in their error, there would have been a most serious cleavage in the church, with the Jewish Christians on the one hand and the Gentile Christians on the other. Paul's differing with Peter saved the day.

But more of the occasions of disunity spring from envy or other sinful disposition. Too many walk according to the flesh and not according to the Spirit of God. For this condition described in 1 Corinthians 3, the great cure is presented in the thirteenth chapter, namely, the pursuit of love. The possession of this love which is from God and is like God will help us to be patient in disappointment. Love does not insist on its own way. It gives us a breadth of sympathy and understanding which even education does not give. To help toward greater unity in the church and among the peoples of the world, let us seek more love; for love is of God.
