The summer months are being marred by what may be called an epidemic of murder. Whether we call it an aftermath of war or trace it to alarmingly increasing consumption of alcoholic beverages, the results are terrifying.

Murder proceeds from the heart. Jesus taught, "You have heard that it was said to the men of old, "Thou shall not kill; and whoever kills shall be liable to judgment." But I say to you that every one who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother, shall be liable to the council, and whoever says, "You fool" shall be liable to the hell of fire."
