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EDITORIAL

Good News, of Great Joy, for All the World. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for behold, I bring you good tidings of great Joy, which shall be to all people. Luke. 2:10.

A very unusual declaration is this, indeed: That there could be Good News of Great Joy, for all people. It is very common for some people to receive good news over which they rejoice, news which many other people, perhaps many of their neighbors or relatives would not be interested in at all.

But here are tidings over which not only all people of the world rejoice, but also, the heavenly host rejoiced, and praised God, saying Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth Peace, good will toward men.

Yes: Joy to all people, was very unusual. We don't read of anything like it, any other time. The reason for this universal rejoicing, the inspired writer tells us, is because a child is born: But, why should all the world rejoice at the birth of a child? It is a very common thing for children to be born, and very often not many, perhaps no one, not even the parents, rejoice over the little stranger's birth.

The unusual rejoicing, is the result of the birth of a very unusual child; there never was, and never will be another born like that child: But why should we, and all the world rejoice over the birth of Mary's child? It is quite natural for normal, loving parents to rejoice over their own children, while perhaps they do not rejoice over the birth of their neighbor's children.

But, wait a minute, let us examine those good tidings again, how does it read? "Unto YOU is born this day in the city of David". And Isaiah the good prophet hundreds of years before this child was born, put in his claim, and said, it's unto US a child is born. Oh: that makes a difference. It is our child, and the angels were rejoicing over the birth of our child. When the angel said, Unto YOU, the ancient prophet said unto US. Those angels did not need that child as we need him for a Saviour, for they never fell.

And when we sing salvation's story, angels fold their wings, for they can never know the joy that our salvation brings". And yet, He saith, "let all the angels of God worship Him."

That unique child, became the Son, that Isaiah said was given unto US as an expression of the Father's love, to redeem the lost guilty race of man. Yes, that child became our Saviour, for that was our great need. Sometimes at this season of the year, gifts are be-

stowed which are not needed, but how much more joy and happiness that gift brings when it fills a long felt need! And how happy the donor feels when the recipient says "Just what I needed."

Money wasted, that would send the gospel to the great hosts in heathen darkness, which would be the means of saving some, perhaps many souls, for whom Christ died. Friends, how can we spend our money on vain, useless things, while esus gave His all, and died to save men, when we know that vast numbers have never heard the gospel. Let us tell the good news of great joy with our money. And we too will rejoice, with Great Joy. "Money talks."
