SCRIPTURE READING

Some time ago a religious education test, taken among a representative group of college under-graduates, all of them nominally Christians of one persuasion or another, disclosed an almost incredible degree of ignorance.

About one-sixth of the students could not give the names of the Four Gospels; only about five per cent of them were able to designate all Ten Commandments. Thus the test made one thing perfectly clear: that for at least a generation there has been little or no religious instruction in American homes, and although the distribution of Bibles may be greater than ever very few of them are being read.—Washington Post.
