In our homes of today we do not want war. We talk against it, we pray for it to cease, and then go right to town and buy our little children toy guns; and if this does not teach them war, then it will teach them to become criminals. I have gone to homes where the little fellows were playing (some of them, innocently) with their toy guns, and they would say, 'I'll shoot you!" or "I'll kill you!" Not so long ago one said to me: "Put up your hands, or I'll blow your head off!" I feel it is sad to teach such to our children and expect them to love the Lord when they grow up. I never had any such training when I was a boy.

God says, "Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Now, I can put many interpretations on that Scripture; but it is either true, or it is not true. Often, children pattern after their parents. What kind of pattern are you? What we teach our children while they are young will mold their lives and characters for later years. Our Bible schools will never relieve us of our parental responsibility. Parents can teach their children to reverence them, their home, and the church, without their ever seeing a Bible school. In fact, a Bible school is not a reformatory, but a place of training. What they are taught in the home, before they are old enough to go to Bible school, does as great a part in molding their lives as the school does, if the home is what it ought to be.

The foundation for Christian character usually begins in the home, and under home training. We can teach them and mold them into almost anything we desire. Many mothers of today use so many unnecessary methods of trying to beautify their children, to make them look "cute" (as they say), and conform to the wishes and desires of others; and on down the line the poor children have to suffer, when they desire to become humble pilgrims.

We are living in a world of sin, and if we do not master sin, it will master us, sooner or later. We can be overcomers, but it will cost us some self-denial. There is such a strong downward pull these days that it renders it difficult for our young folk to stand unless they have our help and prayers; and some leaders in the churches and schools help to lower the standard of good Christian morals. Just open your eyes, and see!

So many of our precious young men have been forced away from their homes and loved ones against their wishes, and those of all concerned. We need some more men at the head of our affairs who fear God, who love righteousness, and hate sin. Many of our affairs could be settled better by prayer and faith than by force. The account stated that she died one hour later in a Long Beach hospital. How many today are playing with sin while the fatal sting is injected into the human soul, assuring eternal death. This writer has seen many pitiable cases, in which those involved were astounded at the depths to which they had fallen, when the light of the Gospel revealed their depravity, and they became aware of their "leprous" condition. Nearly all such persons, however, did no more about it than to relate their pathetic stories, while scalding tears coursed down the crude lines of a sin-scarred face; then closed their stories by cursing their names, declaring, But it is too late for me now."

The devil's second plan is probably the most dangerous to the majority of our readers; and, indeed, it is the tendency to get those who would be religious to miss God's true requirements for the Christian, resulting in a religious form, and possibly some rigid rituals which would take on the appearance of genuine Christian piety.
