A LETTER TO YOU FROM YOUR SELF-DENIAL TREASURER

We wish to thank all those who, in the past years, have supported the Self-Denial Fund. This fund is primarily a Young People's project, but we appreciate very much the support received from our "older young people." Some one has said, "You are only as old as you feel." So we hope you feel young. And surely we are never too old to give, especially for the work of the Lord.

There may still be a question with some as to what the Self-Denial Fund is. First, we would say, it is not your tithe, nor is it any part of the church budget. It is separate from this, and is as the name signifies, a "Self-Denial" Fund. It is that which you can deny yourself, and lay aside each week rather than to spend it on ice cream, candy or what not. It is given on a basis of five, ten or twenty cents a week. That depending on the amount that you want to deny yourself (five, ten and twenty cents a week gives respectively \$2.60, \$5.20 and \$10.40 a year) If you deny yourself one of these amounts weekly, it will seem but little to you, but will mean much to the Self-Denial Fund. voses I task out to notesoo

Do you know that the Self-Denial Fund has in the past five years given to Bethany Bible College \$2,100, to Home Missions \$805, to Foreign Missions \$855, and to Children's Work (D. V. B. S., etc.) \$286. Besides this it has given support to other phases of the work, making a total, for this period of time, of over \$4,000. And all this, by some interested Young People, primarily giving or denying themselves, five, ten or twenty cents a week. I need not say more than this, for you to see that the Young People's Self-Denial Fund is doing a generous and worthy work.

Have you pledged to give to the Self-Denial Fund this year? If not, why not do so now. It is still not too late to pledge and give to the Self-Denial Fund one of the above yearly sums. And if you have made a pledge, do not forget to pay it, for a pledge not paid is as a pledge not made.
