Concerning the Budgets

At the Alliance Sessions of 1948 a budget system for the financing our denominational work was proposed and adopted.

The System Explained

Briefly, the budget system of financing our church projects is this: The estimated cost of supporting our Foreign and Home Missionary work, Bethany Bible College, and the Superintendency is presented to a special committee. This committee allocates to each church specific financial goals for the support of each department of the work, seeking to spread responsibility as fairly as possible, "that there may be equality" in the sharing of the financial burdens of the denominational enterprises.

An Encouraging Response

The response to this new system has been generally encouraging. Each year our people are becoming better acquainted with and accustomed to this plan and favour towards the system has steadily increased. Many of our churches have cheerfully assumed a large share of financial responsibility and have generously given the full amounts requested of them. Other churches, while falling short of the goals set for them, have been giving more generously each year. Only a few churches have failed to make a real effort to raise the money asked of them.

A Goal for This Year

More than two months of the church year still remain and we earnestly request all pastors and people to launch an all-out effort toward a "budgets-paid-in-full" or budgets overpaid" goal before June 15th. The forward movement of our church at home and abroad can only continue and gain momentum as we give it strong financial support. Why not set May 11th, our denomination-wide Sunday School Rally Day, as a "budget-in-full" Sunday, and endeavour to raise what remains unpaid of your church's allocations. Let's go "over the top" in our budgets this year.
