OBITUARY

Irvin O. Trites

The entire community surrounding Moncton mourns the passing of our devout Christian brother, Irvin O. Trites. He was born in Lutes Mountain near Moncton, N. B. in 1881 and left to be with Jesus February 11, 1952 after a brief illness following a stroke. He was a son of the late Rowland and Maria (Lutes) Trites, one of a family of 13 children. In 1908 he married Emily Ann Parrott, who with four daughters and two sons still lives in New Brunswick. Also surviving are one brother, two sisters, and eleven grandchildren.

Early in life he was converted and served in the Reformed Baptist Church for 42 years before the Church of the Nazarene was organized in Moncton. He was responsible for continuing Sunday School for many years in the Reformed Baptist Church when they were without a local pastor. He has been a member of the Lutes Mountain Church of the Nazarene since its organization in 1948, and served more than three years as Sunday School Superintendent and Church treasurer, as well as trustee and Bible Class teacher.

Funeral service was conducted by Rev. R. T. Albertson, pastor of the Lutes Mountain Church and the funeral address was by Rev. J. H. MacGregor, District Superintendent of the Maritime District.

The family gave a beautiful pulpit Bible and lamp in memory of the late Mr. Trites.
