A PLEA TO PARENTS

Dr. W. Leon Tucker told this amazing incident: Dr. Percival, a busy surgeon, was a Christian. He had one daughter, Kitty, whom he loved devotedly. One day she came to her father and told him she was going as a missionary to China. He said, "Kitty, I forbid you ever to go out of my sight." At last she gave up plans for going and married. She had two darling children. I lived next door to Doctor Percival. One day he told me that he had to give up his surgeon's license because of the condition of his eyes. Later he had to have an operation on his eyes. When the bandages were taken from them, his doctor said, "In two weeks you will be totally blind."

Dr. Percival sent for Kitty and the babies to come. He carefully felt their faces and seemed to get a mental picture of them in his finger-tips. He took me out into the light and "looked" at his pastor. It was a sad day in our block, and everyone was weeping.

Months later I went out to lunch with Dr. Percival. I had to help feed him. As he walked home I could see that he wanted to say something. "Say it, Doctor," I said. "Dr. Tucker," said he, "do you think that God is retributive?" I told him I did not believe it. He said, "Tucker, I told Kitty that she could never go out of my sight. Wherever you go, plead with parents to keep out of the way when God calls their children into His service."
