## REDEDICATION SERVICE

Last fall the enlarged Seal Cove Reformed Baptist Church was rededicated.

The pastor, Rev. Ronald T. Sabine, was assisted in the service by: Rev. F. A. Anderson, of Hartland, N. B., who brought the rededication sermon, the church choir, and Mrs. Leavitt Cronk, as soloist.

A very impressive service was conducted with a congregation of 300 in attendance, filling the doubled auditorium facilities. At this time memorial furniture—a very beautiful oak Communion Table and three pulpit chairs—given in memory of deceased deacons by their families, was dedicated; also a fine bulletin board, a gift of the Young People's Society. This bulletin board with a message space three feet by four feet, fluorescently lighted, is a fine advertising medium for the church.

The church building and equipment is a credit to the church and congregation. It greatly aids in accommodating the fine Sunday School with an attendance around two hundred, and the large Sunday night congregations.

This undertaking has been successfully completed by a people loyally united to extend God's cause. Of the \$17,000 cost, less than \$8,000 indebtedness remains and plans have been made to systematically care for this.

With the united support of the church the cause of holiness has a bright future in Seal Cove. To God be all the praise and glory.
