HIGHWAY SUBSCRIPTION MONTH

We are making the month of November Highway Subscription Month and are calling all pastors and churches to co-operate to the full to secure new subscriptions and renewals to the church paper. At the present moment we have 450 subscribers whose subscriptions are over-due. We want to get these renewals and add to them several hundred new subscriptions.

We would seek to impress upon all, the importance of this effort. The financing, and so the publishing of the "Highway" depends upon it. We must have financial help immediately to carry on. In order to encourage an all-out campaign we are asking all pastors and churches to join in a contest. SUGGESTIONS FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL GAINS

What will your attendance board show the first Sunday following Rally Day. Will your gains hold, or will you be back where you started, with only a few in attendance?

Accurate Records and Follow-Up Calls

"Let's see, who was that little boy from down the street who came on Rally Day last year?"

The teacher can most effectively keep record of new scholars. Most classbooks provide space for names and addresses. After the information is recorded, it is the follow-up call that counts.

Lay-Visitation

There must be visitation after the rally if new scholars are to be kept interested. These personal contacts in the homes are important, and the pastor and teachers cannot do it all. This is work in which all can and should share. Put your people to work.

Effective Teaching

Are the teachers the weak points in your Sunday school? Do they attend faithfully? Do they prepare carefully? Do they call on absentees and new scholars? Do they notice and introduce newcomers? A teachers' training course can do wonders for a Sunday school.

Put New Scholars to Work

Make them feel at home and enlist them to help in your Sunday school as soon as possible.

Pray for the New Scholars

The whole purpose of getting children and young people into Sunday school is to get them saved. This is a fine prayer project for midweek prayer services. When the saints of the church meet together to pray on Wednesday night, make your new scholars specific subjects of prayer. Pray them into the kingdom and they will become permanent members of your Sunday school.—Pilgrim Holiness Advocate.
