For several weeks now our attendance has been nearly thirty. This, we feel, is a remarkable increase for us since our last year's attendance averaged only five. Of course, much of this increase is due to the fact that we have lowered our age limit to nine years since many of the contacts made by our Sunday School were of this age group. We also have a comparable group of junior High and High School young people and some who are older.
