OPPORTUNITIES AND OPPOSITIONS

"A great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries." (I Cor. 16:9).

Over against the opened door of Divine Providence are obstructing adversaries. These adversaries would block every way of God and every way of Christian advancement for God. It is well that we realize this, for, if we do, we shall not be concluding that this or that is not God's plan for us because adversaries are opposing. A good illustration of this may be found in the case of Nehemiah, who had to overcome ridicule (2:19), wrath and contempt (4:3), conspiracy (4:7-8), discouragement, even of friends (4:10-12), and selfish greed (5:1-5); but he overcame and built the wall.

It is well we do not faint or become discouraged at the task God has given us. Let us not fail to enter "the open door and effectual" of Providence because there are "many adversaries." Let us trust God and go forward. Victory is sure.
