## Korea: The Land of Refugees

Off the western coast of Korea there is an island where refugees from North Korea collect. They get there by devious routes. Until recently the only man on the island who had a Bible, tied it round his waist and swam from island to island until he finished up with this group of refugees. Recently a Korean Christian from the island made his way to Pusan to ask the Bible Society for books. He had already organized the refugees into Bible Classes and Sunday Schools, but they had no Scriptures or hymn books and so it was very difficult. The Korean Bible Society at once made a free grant of 340 New Testaments and 600 Gospels which the man was able to take back with him.—Bible in the World.

## THE MINISTRY OF THE SPIRIT
