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# Start Where You Are

God's call to service is to every born-again believer. That means you. Never forget this truth: God definitely wants you to serve Him now. Do not wait for a special call. Do not wait for special training. Start where you are. In factory, farm office or kitchen, start where you are.

David did not wait until he was a king, he did not even wait until he was anointed, to start serving God. He started when he was a shepherd, where no one saw him, alone with his sheep and his God. And right where he was, in the course of his work, he did exploits with God. It was while minding sheep that he learned many of the lessons that he recorded in the psalms. There it was that the foundations were laid that made him a "man after God's own heart."

His walk with the Lord in the wilderness prepared him for his victory over Goliath, with an audience of thousands.

It was here that God proved that David could be trusted with a kingship. And this shepherd boy who always served God just where he happened to be, was honored by the Saviour of the world being known as "The Son of David."

It was not in the presence of Ahab that Elijah began to serve the Lord. Back home on the farm in Gilead he had been burdened about the idolatry of Israel and no doubt had been reminding God of His promise that He would withhold the rain if Israel sinned in this way. Some experience of the Lord's methods in similar situations lets us imagine what took place back there when Elijah was praying.

God probably had said, "All right, Elijah, I did say that I would withhold the rain, and because of your faith and prayers I will do it. Now you go to Ahab and tell him that because of Israel's sin there will be no rain until I send you to him again." "Oh, my Lord God," said Elijah, "who am I that I should go to the King with such a message? I only wanted you to keep Your Word and withhold the rain." "But," replied the Lord, "someone must tell them why the rain is withheld, and you are the only one interested enough to do something about it." Finally he was convinced and went.

This almost invariably happens. God puts a burden of prayer on a heart and then allows that one to answer his own prayer. However, God will never send an unprepared servant to do a task for Him. He always plans for our training. When Elijah took the message to Ahab he was obeying God but he was not

trained and prepared to call down fire from Heaven before Israel on Mount Carmel. He still had to spend time in God's training school.

During the following three years Elijah got used to seeing miracles. Every meal was a miracle. But he saw God perform three different types of miracles, each one a step in his training. In the first one Elijah had no part. He simply saw the miracles of ravens bringing him food twice daily. He had a part in the second one, in that he had to make the announcement and speak the word of faith to the widow. The third miracle was entirely at the instigation of Elijah. When the widow's child died he expostulated with the Lord, and, being used to seeing God work he asked Him to "let the child's soul come into him again." And the child lived. This was a great miracle but it was done in the privacy of Elijah's room. He had not yet been ready to do such a miracle in public. Now he was ready. He called fire down from Heaven and turned Israel to God in one day. But he had started serving God back home on the farm.

You can get all of the illustrations you want. God found a frightened man, of a lowly family, of the least of all the tribes of a thoroughly defeated nation and called him a "mighty man of valor" which He had termed him when he was hiding behind the winepress.

Start where you are! God needs you! His strength is made perfect in weakness. All you have to supply is the weakness and the willingness. God will throw the switch that releases the "power that worketh in you," and His purposes will be fulfilled in you. Why not start right where you are?—World Conquest
