YOUNG PEOPLE'S RALLY A TIME OF RICH BLESSING AS MANY YOUNG PEOPLE GATHERED AT MARYSVILLE, N. B.

Approximately one hundred young people arrived in Marysville seeking accommodations during the Annual Young People's Rally which was held from May 21-24. These were not all who attended, however, as there were a great many representing the Fredericton, Barker's Point and Marysville Young People's Societies.

A time of rich blessing and Christian fellowship was enjoyed as young people from nearly all of our churches met together to hear Brother Roland Rice bring many wonderful messages from God's Holy Word, using "Missions" as his theme. Brother Rice, of Los Angeles, California, was accompanied to this Maritime Province from Toronto, Ontario, by Brother Frith, who is Canadian Secretary of the Oriental Missionary Society. Our president of the Denominational Young People's Society, Licentiate Milton (Happy) Bagley, set aside his duties at Bethany Bible College for a few days, in order to preside at our rally services.

Services began on Thursday evening and lasted over Sunday. An interesting and helpful discussion period was held on Sunday morning, when under the leadership of our president, young people freely discussed spiritual and society problems. A short business session was also held, and a motion was passed that an invitation be accepted to hold the next Annual Rally in the Hartland Church. A committee was appointed to arrange to have a banner ready for the Young People's Rally at Beulah Camp, to be presented to the largest-represented society at that and all following

rallies (entertaining societies excluded from contest). It is hoped that this will prove beneficial in promoting a greater interest in attendance at future young people's rallies.

On Saturday afternoon a scavenger hunt was enjoyed at the Dominion Experimental Station—despite wet weather conditions and morning sessions in local schools—when more than one hundred people arrived by buses and cars to participate in the hunt.

Immediately following Saturday evening's message, which included the drawing and explaining of effective Chinese characters, our speaker showed a reel of film which he had taken in Japan. Sunday too, was a full day. Services began with a Love Feast led by Doug McCallum at 9.30 a. m., and young people proved that the hour was not too early to meet in the House of God for prayer and praise. At the close of the Sunday evening's service, all who were able to remain, enjoyed a great time of special and group singing, violin solo by Brother Rice and testimonies from young people who still love God and are serving Him.

Bill LaPointe did a fine job as song-leader, particularly in arranging special numbers by some of our talented Christian young people.

During the week-end rally services, more than 250 people were in attendance, and listened carefully and prayerfully as our brother stressed the importance of—and the need of—CALVARY LOVE in the heart of all of God's children. May each one of us strive to possess this CALVARY LOVE, in order that God might use us in bringing the lost to the foot of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.
