NEW CHURCH ORGANIZED AT WOODWARD'S COVE

We feel that a report from our church at Woodward's Cove would be in order at this time. I believe that some time ago, when reporting our revival at North Head, I gave a brief report of Woodward's Cove.

Last July I had the privilege of preaching in an afternoon open air service at the front of the Christian Advent Church at Woodward's Cove. At that time God put a burden on my heart for that place. It was on my prayer list during the fall and I waited and looked for God to open the way.

On Christmas day, while enjoying my Christmas dinner with my family, a good brother of that church arrived, stating that he was here on business for the Lord, as they were led of Him to call on me. I was called that day to pastor those good folk, and feeling that it was an answer to prayer I accepted the call, with the approval of my people at North Head.

As we laboured together we felt the hand of God in our work, expecting results and fruit, for we felt in His perfect will. Feeling it was time to have special meetings we contacted Brother F. A. Dunlop. He was led to come our way and God used this man of His, and he did not spare himself, but preached the message of a full gospel. Seventeen responded to the call of the Spirit and received definite help, while others were built up and strengthened for a deeper walk with God.

On Sunday, May 10th, we baptized nine candidates, and on May 24th, Pentecost Sunday, Rev. B. C. Cochrane, our Superintendent was with us, with Brother Cann and delegates from the churches of the Island, and a Reformed Baptist Church was organized at Woodward's Cove, with thirteen receiving the right hand of fellowship as charter members, and others ready to follow. Praise the Lord!

The day ended with the presence of the Lord very real and felt by all, and praise and rejoicing continuing until we felt it time to rest because of physical weariness.

We request special prayer for this new babe, and that we may have wisdom in prescribing a balanced formula, that there may be growth in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
