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* Evangelism

The subject of my message this afternoon is evangelism. By evangelism I mean the attempt, by any scriptural means, to bring men to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. In these days, we observe that much is offered in the name of evangelism, which in the final analysis, is not evangelism at all. What is offered is not evangelism for the following reasons: First, it does not make Christ and his atoning work the basis of salvation. Second, it fails to meet man's deepest need, i.e. the satisfaction of his spiritual nature. Third, it defines salvation more in terms of social readjustment than in terms of heart and soul transformation.

Note with me that the church of Jesus Christ was built by evangelism, has survived the ages by evangelism, will triumph in the future by evangelism—the kind of evangelism that exalts Jesus Christ, that debases the sinner, that calls men to repentance, and that is characterized by the mighty presence of God's Holy Spirit. O that today the church of Jesus Christ might experience an old-fashioned revival, brought about by old-fashioned evangelism!

If you do not care for the use of the word "old-fashioned", thinking perhaps that in this modern day the church should be offering a more up-to-date approach, just remember with me that sin has never changed, human nature has never changed, the provision of Calvary's cross has never changed. The old-fashioned way is the modern way.

Jesus said: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No man cometh unto the Father but by me." Peter said in Acts 4:12: "Neither is other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Paul said to the Philippian jailer: "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved." Here is the method of true evangelism. There is none other! The church today does not need a new method. It needs a new motivation. It does not need a new program. It needs a new power. It is tragically true that at a time when multitudes are ready to be born into the kingdom of God, the church has not strength to bring she stood by and took the abuse of throh

Notice with me three things concerning true evangelism. First the motive of evangelism must ever be love. It was love that caused a Holy God to plan a way of redemption for a lost race. It was love that sent Christ to earth to take upon himself the form of a servant. Love made Christ obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. It was love for the souls

of men that motivated the fearless evangelism of Saint Paul. Love for lost souls sent Carey to India, Livingstone to Africa. It was love for souls that caused the blood of martyrs to flow in every corner of the earth.

O that today we might be possessed with a new love for the souls of men. That we might sense a new urgency in getting the gospel out by every available means.

If we have no love for lost souls, we have no motive for evangelism. Without love, there is no urgency, no categorical imperative which rests upon us to go out into the highways and the byways and compel them to come in. May God grip us with such a mighty passion and love for souls that we shall find ourselves staggering beneath the burden. solo od yam old

Notice again that the message of evangelism is a message of good news, a message of power, a miraculous message, a message of deliverance and freedom, peace and a clean conscience. The message of evangelism is that Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners, and that he is able to save to the uttermost them that come unto him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them.

The message is that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, but that God hath laid on him, Jesus Christ, the iniquity of us all. The song writer has expressed it well by saying, "Just as I am, without one plea, but that Thy blood was shed for me."

The message of evangelism is a glorious one. Let us give it out to all men.

Finally, the mission of evangelism. Here is revealed the great eternal purpose of God and nadaud 19H bearson on the central truth of all scripture—the redemption of humanity through Jesus Christ. Apart from God man is lost and damned. By nature man is prone to sin and iniquity. Thus man there salvation in any other: for there is none needs to be saved. Here is the mission of evangelism.
