Editorial COMPANIONSHIP or CHRIST

There are the conditions where we as Christian young people may have companionship and Christ. (Of course having Christ is having companionship in itself.) Then there are the conditions where we may have to decide between a certain companionship and Christ.

I know that there are Christian young people who think that they may go with-and even marry-companions of the opposite sex who are not Christians. Their line of thought is that the companions will not affect their Christian experiences and that their companions may become Christians-two guesses, and poor ones at that. Human experience has not supported these theories very well. Backslidden Christians, unhappy home situations, hidden regrets abound to witness to the contrary.

Apart from the practical evidence against being unequally joined together, there is the scriptural evidence. Note particularly 2 Corinthians 6:14-18.

First of all, observe that God commands: "Be ye not unequally yoked together." Then He condemns: "What fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness?" Next He proposes: "Wherefore come out from among them ... and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you . . ." The truth is strong that our improper relationships with unbelievers affect our relationship with God; and it appears that if we will not give up the associations which God condemns, He will not be our Father.

Always in the long run, young people, we shall discover, whether the hard way or the easy, that we are happier in God's will than C. E. S. our way.
