The junior girls made needle books, and the junior and intermediate boys made woodwork pencil holders also to be used as awards. The intermediate girls made baby jackets for African children. This project was received and carried through by the boys and girls with much enthusiasm. A dedicatory prayer for these materials was made during the closing exercises by Rev. McGeorge.

In response to an altar call, several of the children accepted Christ as their Saviour. Thus we feel that the school was a profitable one, and we are anticipating a better one for next year.
