Workers for the school included a number of qualified teachers from the Church assisted by my wife, and I. It was a joy to realize one of the largest attended D.V.B.S. ever to be held in this Church, with an average attendance of 54, and a total enrolment of 89, including a Young People's Class that was held in the parsonage every evening during that week.

September 2-4 marked another special event — Our local Youth Rally. We all appreciated very much the privilege of having the Bethany Trio with us at that time. The interest ran high during those meetings, and our hearts were challenged with the messages brought by Lic. Stillman Cameron, and Lic. Stewart Steeves. Cedric Landers lead the singing, and Miss Ethel Cochrane accompanied on the piano. We were pleased with the fine attendance which was climaxed when the church was filled in the Sunday afternoon service.

We do not consider these as past events, but rather as factors which have been directly beneficial to our church. One of the results has

been the organization of a Youth Fellowship Group. This is a weekly meeting of the young people in the parsonage, for the purpose of studying God's word, and enjoying Christian fellowship together. These services have been well attended, and we feel that here is a great challenge, and opportunity to reach the youth for Christ, and build a firm foundation for the church of tomorrow.

Men, women, boys and girls are becoming enthused over the Sunday School. Our hope had been for an 80 on Rally Day, but because of united effort the attendance was 97. What did encourage our hearts is that after Rally Day we did not drop back to the fifties, but rather have had 75 and 80 for the last two Sundays. We are already anticipating setting a new record by the time next Rally Day rolls around.

We look forward to many more good things in store for us in the near future. Plans are being made for a Missionary Convention in the near future. The Barker's Point Trio has promised us a week-end soon, so we are eagerly awaiting these events, and praying that God will bless.

As we work, and pray together we believe that the Lord will continue to bless, and save souls that His kingdom may be built up in this place.
