Registration:

All occupants of rooms must report at the Rooms Office at the Hotel upon their arrival regardless of whether they have reservations or not.

Reservations:

Reserved rooms not occupied by the first Saturday night of Camp may be temporarily let until the arrival of those who hold the reservations.

Reservations for the 1956 Camp are to be made at the Office (during the 1955 Camp) or through an appointed individual whose name and address will be announced. Reservations are NOT to be made through the caretakers.

Rent:

Room rent is to be paid at the office only and should be paid at the time of registration.

Rates are fifty cents per person per night; one dollar per double bed per night; ten dollars per double bed per season. The rate per person per night in Cedardale or bunks in other dormitories and cottages is thirty-five cents.
