He invited missionaries to come and preach to his people, and many heard the Word, received the Saviour, and became true and devoted followers of the Lord Jesus. All this sprang from the little girl's penny, given for Jesus' sake, with the desire to spread His Gospel among the lost. How great a fire this little spark kindled!
