THE ETERNAL WORD

An exchange tells of an Englishman, the Earl of Dudley, who, dying a few years ago, left among his effects which were offered for sale his library. With his other books was a set of Voltaire's works. These infidel writings, ninety-two volumes, in beautiful calf binding, sold for \$2.00. On the other hand, the British government paid \$500,000 for the Codex Sinaiticus, the manuscript of the Bible that was obtained from Russia a few years ago.

Greater than the contrast between the prices of the books as cited above is the contrast in the effects produced by following these contrasting philosophies. All that is best in our "Christian" lands is attributable to God's book. What is worst among us has come from rejection, or more often the neeglect, of that Word. The atrocities and the brutishness, the disregard for human life and welfare which prevail in the world today are natural products of the rejection of God's Word.

After less than two hundred years no one wants the works of Voltaire, which attack the Book of God. The Word is still the world's best seller. Many hammers have been broken upon this anvil. Truth is eternal!
