voice today, if we want to be instruments through whom He will bring revival and blessing, we must empty ourselves of all, and allow Him to fill us.

God's call for laborers was not heard by Isaiah before he underwent the purging process. That he was genuinely cleansed is evidenced by the fact that when the call did come he was a willing recruit: "Here am I; send me" (v. 8).

God's commission to all His saved and purified followers is, "Go . . . and tell."

The answer to today's problems in our churches is not found in what we can do now if we are in a state of impurity in God's sight. It will be found, I believe, only when we as individual believers allow God to cleanse us and fill us with His Holy Spirit.

Do we really want revival? Are you willing to be purged? Am I? God grant that we shall answer soundly in the affirmative with the song-writer who penned these words:

"So wash Thou me without, within,
Or purge with fire, if that must be;
No matter how, if only sin
Die out in me, die out in me!"
