

January is designated as "Highway Month" by the Editorial committee of the King's Highway. What would happen to the pastor if nothing were paid on his salary for six months? And yet our missionaries and Bible School teachers need their salaries just as much as pastors do. A good resolution for any church would be to adopt a plan of giving systematically in support of our various denominational enterprises. How about putting this on the budget list?

Brother Nicholson is rendering a fine service for our Church and we are sure that he will be warmly welcomed by our pastors and people and believe his message concerning our Home Mission work will receive a ready and hearty response.
