it happened and the disciples were left alone to battle against it. How like life. The temptation ever is, when intense opposition arises and almost insurmountable difficulties develop, for the soul to conclude he is out of divine order — not going under divine appointment. This is a satanic falsehood, proved to be such on almost every page of the Bible.

Now let us look just a bit further into this beautiful but frightening narrative. Jesus, the exhausted man, suddenly becomes Christ, the element-controlling God. Let it be noted that this God-Man had more difficulty stilling the storm in the human soul than He did in stilling the storm on the sea. It is always thus. He commands the winds and the sea, and they obey Him, but man falters, questions, and very fearfully commits Himself to the Lord.

No trusting child of God is destined to be raised in a sheltered nook. We are appointed to hardship and suffering—hardship and hindered work. This is the heritage of those who love God.

Then let the storms come; He controls them. They blow at His will. And let it be remembered: "There is nothing too hard for God."

Storms may come, but fear not. They blow by His permission, for "He knows, He loves, He cares."


