# CONVERSION OF LEW WALLACE

Lew Wallace and Robert Ingersoll were both skeptics and cynical toward the Bible and Christianity. They were noted for their infidelity. These two men were riding together in a train coach. Ingersoll suggested to Wallace that he should write a life of Christ, tearing down all the sentiments about Him and writing of Him only as a man. "This will make you a famous man," he said. Lew Wallace decided to do it. He spent years collecting material. He was writing on the second or third chapter one night at one o'clock. As he studied and wrote, carefully examining his material and the facts before him, he came to see that Jesus was a unique character. He saw that there had never been another like this Man born in Bethlehem of Judea. "Surely He must be all the Bible claims Him to be. If He is, then He is my Saviour. I am foolish and an ingrate if I fail to accept Him." He was saved that night. He went to his wife's bedroom and told her what had happened. With her arms around him, she said, "Lew, I have been praying for this ever since you made known your purpose to write the book."

His material and research then served another purpose, for there flowed from his pen a famous book of faith, which was given the title Ben Hur.
