EDITORIAL

BEULAH CAMP 1957

The event of the year for Reformed Baptists is Beulah Camp Meeting. For months previous to this convocation we think of, pray and plan for, this ten-day spiritual assembly.

He now serves as a full-time evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene and ministers from coast to coast in revival campaigns, conventions, and Camp Meetings. THE MUSIC

The wealth of musical talent which God has given to our church will be serving at this year's Beulah Camp. SOUTH AFRICA'S BILLY GRAHAM

One of the most remarkable of native evangelists in the Union of South Africa today is 46-year-old Nicholas Bhengu. Known as South Africa's Billy Graham, Mr. Bhengu draws thousands of people to his meetings. He is a Spirit-filled man of God, and has mastered English, Sesuto, Scephuana, Shangaan and Tonga, as well as a little Afrikaans, and Zulu, his home language. Crowds of tsatsis (young native criminals) have been converted under his ministry and have surrendered their knives to him. Day after day this indefatigable evangelist preaches the full gospel of Jesus Christ to all sorts of sinners.

At one meeting in Kimberley, 10,000 people were present. The effect of such preaching upon some of the crime-infested areas in the Union has been miraculous. Perhaps the most outstanding results have been achieved at Clermont, near Durban. Today, in marked contrast to former times, people walk along the streets of the township without fear of being molested. To God be the glory. —The Flame (England).
