



Fredericton, N. B.: On Sunday, Sept. 29th, we closed a fruitful evangelistic campaign. Attendance was splendid throughout, the highest in any campaign since our pastoral work in the city. On three or four different occasions we had to bring extra chairs into the auditorium to seat the people. Special workers for the campaign were Dr. C. I. Armstrong, Sept. 11-17; Rev. N. E. Trafton, 18-20; Rev. Karl Gorman, 23-29, and Deverne Mullen 18-29. It was an unusual campaign in respect to the arrangement for preaching, but God blessed the ministry of each man and there was fine co-ordination under the leading of the Holy Spirit. Dr. Armstrong's ministry was enriching and large congregations came to hear him. Two nights of missionary emphasis were much enjoyed. The last night of Dr. Armstrong's ministry to us was the presentation of our own African and Rhodesian work, based on a report of his travels in Africa and among our people there last winter. The church was filled to capacity for this great service. The preaching of Revs. Trafton and Gorman was also of the highest order and their ministeries were much appreciated by large congregations. Deverne Mullen's singing was better than ever and it was a joy to have him with us again. In all, it was a fine campaign, the best of the years we have been labouring in Fredericton. There was some outstanding victories and the work of the church is more promising than ever before. Some of those saved in the meetings will be a great strength to the church.
