EDITORIALS

BEULAH CAMP 1957

In the good providence of God we have enjoyed another Beulah Camp Meeting. For ten days we were privileged to "sit together in heavenly places" at our beautiful and sacred Beulah Camp Ground. The ministry of the Word was helpful, the singing and music were inspirational and the fellowship was enriching.

Rev. Fred Thomas, Camp Evangelist, laboured fervently and faithfully. He preached the Word without fear or favour and sought with all diligence to persuade his hearers to seek needed spiritual help. Many testified of having received spiritual help under his ministry. The personal friendliness af Brother Thomas was also much appreciated.

Song Evangelist DeVerne Mullen was the Camp songleader and soloist, and his ministry of music was, as usual, of a high order. His service was especially meaningful because of the circumstances under which he laboured. He came to Camp just a week after his mother's funeral, and his dad, brother Paul, sister-in-law Carrie, and nephew David were still in hospital. So he bore heavy burdens on his heart. There were large altars at this year's Camp and some outstanding victories. Some found Christ for the first time, some returned to God after long, long years of backsliding, and others were sanctified wholly. God alone knows of all the good done around the Tabernacle altars this year.

He was preacher at the closing service of this year's meeting of the great National Holiness Association rally in Minneapolis. He is a fine personality and a dynamic speaker. Rev. and Mrs. Jack MacKenzie will again have charge of music at Riverside. Jack and Charlene are both well known and well beloved and the announcements of their coming for the camp will be welcomed.
