


SHELBURNE, NOVA SCOTIA



In an area long since regarded as neglected by the holiness people, or a place that seemed to be inmune to such a message, one of our young licentiates, Oland Kent, found himself led by circumstances and with a tremendous burden for the people and surrounding communities. With his wife, Elsie, Bro. Kent started to preach the Gospel at Sandy Point, four miles below Shelburne, and also eighteen miles in the opposite direction at Ingomar. God honored His Word and His servant: sinners were saved, backsliders reclaimed and believers sanctified. When this consecrated young couple felt the need of further preparation for the Gospel ministry, it was their concern that the work they had started, and labored for on their knees, might continue. With a note of unusual concern, this request was made to the Home Mission Board: "Can you send someone to Shelburne to carry on the work"? Who would go? Again the Student Body at Bethany stepped into the gap and provided supplies, although the distance was considerable.

One of the students who supplied the Shelburne field was William Burbury. Before he graduated from Bethany, God called him with an inner persuasion that would not be silenced by more attractive offers. Following Beulah Camp of last Summer, Bro. and Sister Burbury, with their three children, moved to their new "harvest field". They have entered into the work with enthusiasm and spiritual concern, which has already been marked by unusual success. We can well be proud of our Home Missionaries on the Shelburne Field—Rev. and Mrs. William Burbury.

The above notice is to remind our people that Bethany Sunday is near. Already pastors have received a circular letter informing them of Bethany's need. Our circular also encouraged them to boost Bethany that February 9th might be a real day of blessing for Bethany.

In the previous issue of the Highway, our Budget Thermometer indicated that only 46% of the Bethany Budget presently due has been received. 54% of our churches (27 churches) have paid nothing on their Bethany Budget to date. This picture has changed very little since we last wrote to the Highway. Our Bethany Budgets are well over \$2,000 behind schedule. Consider this fact together with the fact that some of our bills have not been paid for three months due to lack of funds. Consider also that it costs us approximately \$2,000 a month to operate. By the time this article reaches the Highway, our needs will be well in excess of \$3,000. These facts should remind us that Bethany needs special HELP NOW.

Any assistance our churches might render will be appreciated, as we have always been appreciative of churches that are faithful in supporting Bethany. May God bless those who have been standing by us in the work.

It is our hope that pastors will encourage their people to boost Bethany; and, that our people will encourage their pastor to boost Bethany. It is by mutual co-operation and interest, as well as by united effort, that we together shall be able to make Bethany a place of blessing.

Let us not allow God's work to die on our hands. Our hands are the only hands He uses to work through. Through His people, God is able to make Bethany a place of blessing as she continues to mould the lives of youth and prepare them for the service of the King of Kings.
