Two people have sought the Lord for salvation at our altars recently and eleven others have requested prayer. Thus, we are tremendously encouraged with the work, for we are conscious that God is in the midst.

Easter was a time of special blessing for us. Bethany students assisted in conducting four services, with nearly a hundred attending the closing service. Many of this number were unsaved.

The work at Ingomar is encouraging. Our Building Fund is growing "slow but sure," and we expect soon to be under way in the construction program. Do pray that God will bless this venture of faith and that very soon the good folk out there will have a building. Presently services are being held in a home.

The recently organized Sunday School at Sandy Point is proving to be a worthwhile project. Last week our attendance record was broken and we have the promise of new scholars for this Sunday. How we feel to magnify the name of the Lord!

At present we are endeavoring to line up a program for the town of Shelburne. Although it is a comparatively small town, yet it is desperately wicked. To illustrate, in the short space of five months we have had two suicides, murder, rape, and a stabbing, with many lesser crimes, too numerous to mention, also in evidence, Pray with us that God will send us a revival of Holiness and Salvation.

Mrs. Burbury and myself feel it a great privilege to be associated with such a fine group of people as we have here. Although the actual membership is relatively small, yet our people make up for it with their big hearts. The folk are continually bringing in tokens of their love to us in the form of fish, meat, groceries, preserves, bedding, money and many other useful things. Truly God is supplying all of our needs according to His riches in glory.

Please do not assume from this report that Satan has left our area. No, he is working overtime to defeat our work and our souls, "But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ". Yes, "If God be for us, who can be against us."

BETHANY'S:-S.O.S.

It is with regret that we feel that we must make another appeal for financial help for Bethany. We must face facts, and the facts are grim. On April 15th we practically drained our treasury to pay the staff salaries. The bills outstanding are well in excess of a thousand dollars. In the face of Bethany's need is also the fact that little money has been coming in from our churches of late. During the month of March less money came in than we normally receive during the Summer months when the school is not in operation. Only three contributions from churches have thus far been made to Bethany during the month of April. In view of the fact that it costs us an excess of \$2,000.00 a month to operate we must recognize Bethany's embarassing position financially.

By the time the readers of the Highway receive this information, there will remain less than one month in the church year. With the Church year almost completed we find the Bethany budgets running behind schedule in many churches. Nearly \$2,000.00 remains to be paid on Bethany budgets.

We do want to thank those churches which have been so faithful in their support. May God bless you richly. Your cooperation reminds us that you are sharing in the work of the Lord.

To those churches not having paid regularly on their Bethany budget we want to say please do something to help us now. The following will give you a picture of the Bethany budget situation: 46% of the churches paid in full. 54% of the churches are still owing on their Bethany Budget. 23 churches owe more than 25% of their Bethany Budget. 15 churches owe more than 50%. 7 churches have paid NOTHING on their Bethany Budget. Will these Budgets balance by May 31st? That will depend on your vision as a church.

These facts should arouse concern in view of the fact that we are merely speaking of current operating expenses of the college. The fire losses and demands upon us are entirely separate from our current operating expense. Our immediate concern is that we receive help from you now. Let us be still long enough to let God speak to us. Then, let us give as He directs.
