The period already spent in this office has been very interesting to me. The friendliness of our people, the graciousness of our pastors have helped me greatly in my visits to the churches. I sense not only a kindly reception to me personally, but a friendly reaction toward the office, which means much to me indeed. I pray a service may be given to our people which will merit the expenditure involved.

I desire to be engaged constantly in worthwhile tasks. If I can assist in any way our smaller churches, this will be agreeable to me. Already I am booked for revival services and in as much as time will allow, this work I enjoy. I feel a very great need of venturing in new places—places where our message is not preached. I am so completely sold to the gospel we preach that I am dedicated to making known to certain areas the news of a full Redemption from outward and inward pollution. I feel we cannot be hesitant in entering places simply because churches already are operative. In any pioneer work this year we are going to feel the loss of brother Nicholson greatly. However, we are confident he is where God needs him, consequently, the loss will be atoned for by some other means. Please honor your pledge to the "Jets". One dollar is no burden to any of us at any time, but the hundreds of them that come into our Home Mission treasury when our people respond make the difference between success and failure somewhere along the line. We have several new churches in the process of building at present. A lift of Five Hundred dollars means much to these churches. Following Riverside, we begin revival services at New Denmark, Victoria County. Will you pray that God will use us in that most delightful farming area of the Maritimes? If we can turn the hearts of the people there to our Christ a work could be started that could result in several churches being organized in that great part of our Province. Make this Meeting a special matter of prayer. Rev. and Mrs. Arnold Stairs and Rev. and Mrs. Bruce Bridgeo will be the special workers for this important effort. A fine team of workers, but we need much prayer.
