

DEDICATION SERVICE

The dedication of the East Ferry Reformed Baptist Church, which was held on December 12, marked another step forward in the work of the Lord and the spreading of the message of holiness. Under the leadership of Rev. and Mrs. Gerald Mac-Kinnon, the people of East Ferry have built one of the finest rural churches that we have in our denomination. A short time before the service the sound of beautiful chimes rang out through the snow flakes and driving wind to notify the surrounding area that the special time had come. As the worshippers drew near they were welcomed by friendly lights beckoning them through beautiful colored windows. The first impression one receives when entering the building is of joyful satisfaction. "They have done things well" is the reverend whisper. The right temperature gained by a modern oil-heating system brings the assurance of a more successful time of worship. The church building looms up majestically white from its prominent location in the rommunity and seems to speak with quiet assurance of great things to be accomplished in that place and among those people who have labored and sacrificed to bring it into being. Less than three thousand dollars, is owing on this beautiful house of worship that is worth over twelve thousand. Due to the last rush in completing plans, word did not reach our churches of the time of dedication and therefore your letter of congratulation was not among the few read in the service. Would it not be greatly appreciated by the people of East Ferry, as well, as brother and sister MacKinnon, if each of our churches still forwarded letters to convey our appreciations and best wishes for this another "light house" along the Fundy
