Due to our anticipated furlough during this year a decision was taken at the recent conference to change the location of the Bible School to Altona Mission Station for the period of our absence. It will be under the leadership of Bro. Glendon Kierstead. We, personally, are happy to leave it in what we feel are such capable hands and believe that with God's blessings a great and valuable future is in store for it.

Being free of that responsibility we are enthusiastically and prayerfully laying plans for some concentrated evangelistic effort and kraal visitation among the local outposts during these remaining months before going on furlough. For those of you who make specific requests in your prayers for the mission work we would lay before you a weeks meetings to be held at the new Entsheni outpost from Feb. 10-16. We are also planning several days meetings at Kwabanakile from Jan. 29-Feb. 2. Should both of these meetings pass before you receive this letter through the Highway, pray for the seed that has been sown that it might find soil in which to later spring up. Plans are being arranged for meetings at Gobeni and possibility at Sitole and Enhlangwini but are not yet finalized. Keep these places on your prayer list.

With plans being made by the Mission Board for us to reach home before Beulah we are eagerly looking forward to meeting many of our friends there. We are trusting God to make our time at home a blessing to the Church and to be fruitful in the extension of His kingdom.

It is loss when the Lord has entrusted us with money for His work and we spend it on ourselves and objects outside His work. It is loss when we know that the Lord wants our life for His service and we refuse to give it to Him because the cost, we suppose, is too great. Oh, may we acquire the mind of Christ who left heaven's glory and came down even to death, the death of the cross, that He might rescue precious souls from the power of darkness and translate them to a glorious, abiding inheritance in His kingdom. God so loved that He gave even His only begotten Son. Let us allow His love, which has been shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, to control our days, our plans, our lives.

To win precious souls we must leave nothing undone on our part. We must not permit Satan, God's enemy and ours, to capture our time, our means, or our lives. Neither our dearest friends nor our loved ones should be allowed to lead us astray from the fruitfulness which the Lord has planned for us, with His rich eternal reward at the end of our service. God will show us the great need of taking the gospel to the lost if we seek His face for this grace. Full salvation He has provided. Are we making this good news known to perishing souls?
