



REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH ORGANIZED AT DEER ISLAND, N. B.

On the afternoon of June 6th, the writer, in company with Rev. and Mrs. Randolph Nicholson and their daughters Sandra and Mavis, motored to Lambertville, Deer Island. That evening, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Burdette Greenlaw, a meeting was held and the Lambertville Reformed Baptist Church was organized. Rev. A. D. Cann was also in attendance and assisted in the service.

The history of this Church is indeed interesting. Just who is most responsible for its inception is difficult to determine. We know that one of the charter members, Mrs. Fountaine, formerly Miss Brown, from Blacks Harbor, prayed much for a Reformed Baptist church to be organized on the Island. It is very possible the prayers of this woman set in motion the efforts that finally resulted in the organization.

Some two years ago brother Samuel Guptil, of Grand Harbor, Grand Manan, was having a boat built at Deer Island. At that time Bro. Guptil was invited to hold meetings in one of the Island churches. This meeting resulted in several people being converted, as well as being instructed in the way of holiness. Some sought and obtained the experience, and then the hunger grew for a church where the full Gospel would be proclaimed. Hence, the present organization.

Seven members united with the church. These each gave definite testimony to God's saving grace. Some witnessed to the "Second Blessing" properly so called, and all professed faith in the same, with purpose to seek until wholly sanctified. The following is a copy of the minutes of the Meeting:

"On June 6th, a meeting was held at the home of Burdette Greenlaw, Lambertville, Deer Island, for the purpose of organizing a Reformed Baptist Church. The Service was conducted by Rev. F. A. Dunlop, with Rev. R. Nicholson and Rev. A. D. Cann assisting.

Service opened with hymn "The Church's One Foundation", followed by prayer. The Bible was presented and the church covenant read by Rev. F. A. Dunlop. It was moved by Burdette Greenlaw and seconded, by Carvell Lambert that the church covenant be adopted. Prayer of consecration and the Right Hand Of Fellowship was given by Rev. A. D. Cann. Address given to church members by Rev. Nicholson.

After the singing of hymn "My Burden Is Gone", there was a short testimony service, followed by the closing prayer." Miss Nellie Holmes, Clerk.

We were all very conscious of God's presence throughout this service. The testimony service was one of the most wholesome and inspiring I have attended. I look for fine things from this church. Already they have purchased a building which is to be converted into a house of worship. If some who desire to see the Cause of Holiness grow could send Mr. Burdette a donation on their church building I know it would be much appreciated. Even a small gift will help greatly.
