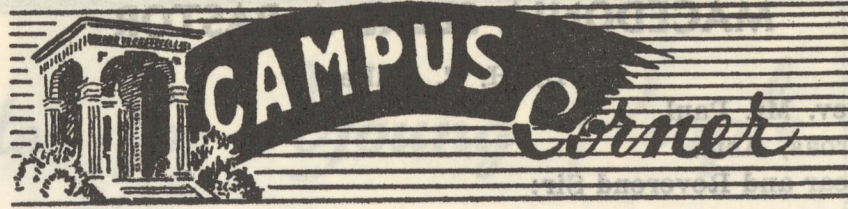
PROJECT FOR BEULAH CAMPGROUND
