RELIGIOUS NEWS ITEMS

Dr. Oswald Smith, internationally-known pastor of the People's Church, of Toronto, Canada, has resigned as pastor after thirty years of fruitful service. His son, Rev. Paul Smith, has been appointed successor to his father. Dr. Smith will continue to serve as president of the People's Missionary Society. Dr. Smith has had a remarkable career in Christian service, and has made a unique contribution to the Kingdom of God as preacher, writer, hymn composer, and supporter of world missions. His vision for the spread of the Gospel has provoked many to love and good works, and the achievement of his own church in missionary giving has been most remarkable. It was my privilege to meet and be under the influence of Dr. Smith while I was attending Bible School, and his missionary vision had a profound effect upon me. We trust that the ministry of this illustrious servant of God may be continued through writing and hymn composition.

The Church of the Nazarene realized some outstanding achievements during its Golden Anniversary year of 1958. 232 new congregations were started, church membership increased by 9,500, putting their total over 300,000, and record sums were raised for missions. Two special offerings at Easter and Thanksgiving brought in a total of more than \$2,000,000 for Home and Foreign Missions. At the beginning of 1959 new missionaries were appointed by the General Board, bringing the number of full-time workers on foreign fields to about 450. May the good work of this Church continue and abound.

The 1959 Convention of the National Holiness Association will convene at Cincinnati, Ohio, March 31-April 2. "We Are His Witnesses" will be the Convention theme and among the speakers are: Dr. Paul S. Rees, Dr. Harry Jessup, Dr. Bob Cook, Dr. T. M. Anderson, Mr. Stanley Tam, well-known Christian business man, and others.

OUR CATHECHISMS

The Catechism of our Church has been translated into the Zulu language and is being used by our missionaries. This is the third language in which our Catechism has appeared, our own native tongue, a translation for use in Haiti, and now into Zulu.
