On April 14, the Home Mission Board met at Sussex, N. B. to consider present obligations and the possibility of meeting the challenge of the future. There was a full representation of Board members and favorable reports were heard over the entire field.

The treasurer spoke favorably of the interest our people have taken in the financial appeal launched a short time ago. Three different parties responded to the "Gospel Jets" with one hundred dollars each instead of one dollar.

Rev. Arnold Stairs has reported on the New Denmark Field since our meeting and he is feeling that his work is just beginning. Miss Sheila Graham so felt the challenge of the work there, while she assisted Brother Stairs in special services, that she offered to support the work to the extent of \$20.00 a month. Thank God our young people are feeling the challenge!

In spite of the above-mentioned causes for rejoicing, still there faces us two of our hardest months between now and Beulah. Most of the Budgets are paid, and more—thanks to these churches. We have been running far behind financially. To ask our men, with their families, to live on less than forty dollars a week is not a good example of our work in new places, yet many of them have been existing on much less. "Why is this?" you ask. The reason lies in the fact that we were faced with challenges that, as a Board, we would have felt guilty to ignore. Then we expected that by this time some of our areas would be self-supporting. However, due to unemployment and other reverses this has not yet come to pass.

What are we asking for? Nothing more than what our people always do; just do your best for us between now and Beulah.

There has been some real opportunities for us to purchase properties at bargain prices this year, but we had to pass them by. The properties mentioned could have been a great asset to some of our new places. There are facing us other opportunities. Will we have to pass them up also? I don't think so. We mentioned, in the Highway, some time ago of a FUND we were opening that would solve our financial problem if successfully carried out with our present program of "budget" and "jet" systems. Yes, we mean solve our financial problem; Already we have \$1,150.00 in this FUND.
