enthusiasm. "New wine," says Arthur Wallis, "requires new wine-skins, and if the old are not prepared to be renewed, remodelled by the Spirit of God to meet the new situation, God has no alternative but to reject them." Calvary has provided all that we need. We must be hot, flaming, burning out for God or we will be cast out by God and rejected by man. Jesus Christ has made full provision for sin, self and spiritual incompetence.

We are not ready to surrender to our age! If this is the Laodicean age, then thank God there is hope. We are not to resign ourselves fatalistically to this age simply because we believe we are in the end times! Is the Laodicean church, as pictured to us in Revelation, an example to follow or a condition to condone? I believe not! Predictions of judgments are always accompanied by predictions of deferments, if we will but "hear his voice and be zealous to repent."
