A PLEA FOR EXPOSITORY PREACHING

answer, but no doubt one of the biggest reasons is the work involved in their production. Expository sermons are not produced by quickly stringing together a number of illustrations which have a real or fancied application to the text being treated. Neither can an expository sermon be preached by merely treating some inferential suggestions that may arise out of a casual reflection on a text.

Consider a few simple words concerning the preparation of this type of message. First, the passage is found, or better still, the passage finds you. This may come as a result of the study of the Word or as some current need of the church suggests the passage. Often the entire passage begins to attract simply because one verse or thought has "leaped to the preacher's heart." For instance, the expression "God is faithful" may grip the preacher until, upon investigating the statement, he finds a wealth of material by examining the context where the statement is used in the Bible.

Secondly, a note of warning. Preachers should beware of abortive efforts in the production of any message. Often the thoughts do not coordinate themselves because too little time has been given to the matter of meditation and "soaking" in the atmosphere of the passage. One need not try to superinduce the message, but by prayerful study the streams of thought begin to flow and the material will begin to fall into logical sequence.

It is not meant by this that any indolence is to be indulged in, but rather a caution against forcing the

passage by prematurely trying to co-ordinate your thinking. The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to lubricate the processes of thought. Give him a chance. Don't hurry but wait, wait, wait until-.

Thirdly, a word with respect to the place of helps. By daily study and meditation with helps the spiritual reservoir will be filled. To avoid being bookish and dry, it is best to allow the Spirit to draw from the reservoir without any new appeal to helps except to refresh or confirm a quotation which is brought to remembrance. This may not appear practical to some, but it seems to be the way of freshness and dependence upon the Spirit. Here is a wholesome value of expository preaching in that if our reservoir be full we must daily give ourselves to "prayer and the ministry of the Word."

My brother, start now to be an expositor. Try the Psalms, a Gospel incident, a recorded prayer, or some other appealing passage. Above all, remember to be faithful to the Word. We are not called to give our views and opinions but to reveal His mind. Let us seek to teach what He intends to reveal. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
