## **EDITORIALS**

#### RIVERSIDE CAMP MEETING

God willing, Riverside Camp Meeting will be held at Robinson, Maine, August 14-23. The Musical Bertolets are the engaged workers for this year's Camp.

Riverside Camp is located in the heart of beautiful and fertile Aroostock County, famed potato-growing area of the U. S. A. One of the delights of attending this Camp Meeting is the drive through this wonderful farming country. The vast potato and grain fields are a sight to behold. If the Woodstock-Centreville, N. B., route is followed by those who travel from the Canadian side of the border, the scenery of that section, and the country between Houlton and Presque Isle that may be seen with little extra travel by those who can spend a few days at the Camp, is some of the most beautiful to be found anywhere.

The Riverside Camp Ground is located about twenty-five miles north of Houlton, less than a mile off State Highway No. 1, between the towns of Bridgewater and Mars Hill. Room and board are provided in the Camp Hotel and a spacious Tabernacle, larger than our Beulah Camp Tabernacle, is the setting for the services.

The Musical Bertolets are newcomers to our denomination. They are evangelists of the Church of the Nazarene and are highly recommended as an evangelistic team. They render a varied musical ministry, both vocal and instrumental, and Brother Bertolet preaches.

Riverside Camp is maintained chiefly by the interest and support of the pastors and people of our Aroostook and Central New Brunswick Districts. Attendance at Alliance and Beulah Camp, and special demands of the local church programme, usually prevent many from more distant points from attending. Any who do make the effort necessary are well rewarded by the spiritual fellowship enjoyed at the Camp.

A Missionary Rally will be held at Riverside again this year. It is scheduled for Tuesday evening. August 16th., with Bill and Elsie Morgan as special speakers and singers. The Riverside Missionary Rallies have drawn some of the best crowds attending the week-night services at Riverside, and have been considered by many as outstanding in the Camp services.

Let us unite our prayers for this year's Riverside Camp.

#### OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

Among the special events of our denominational summer programme are our Youth Camps. By the time this Highway goes to press the Beulah Youth Camp will be over and the Riverside Youth Camp will be in progress. In recent years we have had a third Camp on the Bethany Bible College Campus at Yarmouth, N. S.

Thus far we have only heard reports of enrollment and services of Beulah Youth Camp. Reports on the others will be coming in later. At Beulah upwards of one hundred young people were enrolled. We were in attendance at the opening service and had the joy of seeing and sensing the enthusiasm of these teen-agers who were beginning the ten-day encampment.

Our denomination is highly favoured in having so many fine, capable, and consecrated Christian young people. The annual youth rallies and youth camps remind us of how fortunate we are in having such an army of boys and girls, young men and young women, who are living for God and serving our Church. Few denominations have as high a percentage of converted, consecrated youth as does our Reformed Baptist Church.

Pastors and senior lay people will do well to give special attention to the teen-age and young adult group in their churches and congregations. There is potential for service in young people that wisely and willingly used can give great power to the local church programme. It is a deplorable state of affairs when older people in the church begin to feel that they are being crowded out because young people are being entrusted with responsibility. It is a happy condition in any church when the senior group gladly makes place for the energy and initiative of youth, willingly commit work of the church to them, and assist in whatever way they can to make the efforts of the young workers successful and fruitful. The ideal situation in this matter is for young people to recognize and appreciate the wealth of their heritage in and from the older people, and the older people to rejoice in the presence and potential of those who are coming on to take their places and do all they can to encourage and help them in Christian living and service.

We may well thank God for our young people. The late Dr. O. G. Wilson, speaking at the Spring Rally of our Young People's Association, "the young people are not only the Church of to-morrow, they are the Church of to-day!"
