Dear Highway Friends,

Beulah — dear old Beulah! The memories oh so sweet! One longs to be there again with you all this year. What Beulah has meant to me! Spiritual battles, victories, blessings and visions and revelations of God's will for me! I'm so glad I obeyed Him. He has never failed to keep His promises to me. He is so wonderful to me. Praise His name! He is my Saviour, Sanctifier, Keeper and coming Lord. Oh! to be counted worthy to be His Bride, Oh, to be able to stir others to be ready too!

We had to leave our nice home at 184 Hlobane Street, as the house was sold. We at last found some rooms at 110 East Street where we are living now.

He told me his troubles and from God's precious word I was enabled to give Him the needed enlightenment. There is a young preacher here (a R. B.) graduate from our Bible School. He is trying to contact him and needs your prayers. I told him of this troubled soul. He is a fine worker!

Then there is the Russelite convert. She came selling eggs. I asked, "Have you been saved?" She did not know what that meant. I carefully explained. She had left the Lutheran Church, and joined the Russelites. I said "Your soul is seeking something — it is this — salvation." Her amazing reply, instead of the usual argument, was, "Yes, I want it." It was just a few minutes later that she arose from her knees with a shining face saying, "I've got it! Jesus saves me!" She also needs prayer.

We have frequent calls from our missionaries — Paul and Mary and their two sons stayed 2 days with us on their way to Durban. The Gormans and the Morgans called in. In April Charles, Myra and family called in. Glendon and Betty and Bro. Eugene Kierstead also were here. Sunday we visited the Kiersteads. It was good to hear how God undertook for Bro. Eugene when he was so very ill, Truly we have a wonderful God who answered prayer.

We pray that you will have a very blessed time at Beulah this year — and those of you who cannot go will be blessed at home.
