Rev. C. W. Butler, D.D., has gone to be with the Lord. At eighty-six years of age, Dr. Butler was still active in the work of the ministry, and was conducting a meeting in the State of Oregon when the Lord called him.

Dr. Butler was one of the great holiness preachers of the last century. He was an able exponent of the Wesleyan and Pauline doctrine of entire sanctification. It was our privilege to have Dr. Butler at Beulah Camp as evangelist three times, in 1932, 1934, and 1936. The memory of his ministry among us is remembered with deepest appreciation by many. He served the strong meat of the Word, and his messages were faith-building.

The cause of Holiness has suffered a great loss in the passing of this venerable minister of God. With those who have heard the "greats" who have preached from Beulah's Tabernacle platform, will rank Dr. Butler with H. C. Morrison, Joseph H. Smith, Beverley Carradine, E. P. Walker, and others.
