The service came to a glorious climax by the singing of "Showers of Blessing." Some who have been saved for many years said: "It is the most glorious baptism we have ever seen."

To God be the praise and Glory! He hath done great things for us, whereof we are glad.

Our farewell service was a blessed one as many sought pardon and cleansing.

A farewell party was given us and we received a wonderful purse of money, for which we praise the Lord.

We found many wonderful people in this part of God's vineyard and were privileged to make our home with a wonderful Christian Couple. Theirs was a rich fellowship we shall always remember.

Truly God has given us mothers, fathers, brothers and sisters, and we are thankful for Christian Fellowship which is ours "all because of Calvary."

There is a good group of staunch holiness people in Linneus and let us pray that God will continue to keep the work of Holiness there.
