Often young people are accused of being as unstable as the wind, or just plain flighty. These accusiations are not without some grounds, for youth is probably the most turbulent period of life. There is the matter of making adjustments, finding onesself and growing up, none of which are simple.

The fact that one is a Christian will not exempt him from the social pressures or from spiritual influences. Being a Christian will help one to maintain his equilibrium in spite of the powers which may be arrayed against him.

There is nothing which will do more to bring one stability of life than complete surrender to the will of God. That amounts to consecration. As a result of our consecration, God will do a work of grace that will expel the here-to-fore uncontrolled passions which brought with them instability. This work of grace is the crisis experience of Sanctification. Without His grace one will be unsettled and unstable. However, with it comes the groundwork for stability of life and character.

The experience of sanctification does not always enable one to immediately determine God's plan for his life's work, but it does put within one a "willingness" to do that to which God leads or calls. Uncertainty of God's plan is not instability, if there is the "willingness" to do God's will as it is revealed to us. Obedience to God's will makes one stable.

God's will is not dry and unexciting. The Psalmist found stability in God's will. He found, fullness of joy and pleasures, which he maintained would be forevermore.
