The resignation of Rev. R. H. Nicholson as president of the Home Mission Board, at the recent Alliance Session, came as a great surprise to many.

Having been appointed to fill the office vacated by Mr. Nicholson, I wish to commend him for the immense contribution he has made to the extension of God's work, and our denomination during the past ten years. Under his direction the Home Mission Department of our church has become a well-organized and an offensive power against sin and the devil in the Maritimes and Maine. In many communities and cities Satan has been caused to retreat.

Thank God for such efficient leadership which has been rendered to our Church and our God through the unstinting service of Rev. R. H. Nicholson.

It is with a deep sense of unworthiness and inadequacy that I assume the responsibilities of this office. However I trust that the Lord will help me to render useful service to the Kingdom and to the Church.

Merely to maintain the well-organized program that has been promoted under the direction of Mr. Nicholson, one will need a great deal of help from God. Rev. G. Inman was elected to fill the office of the treasurer. Mr. Inman is also assuming the pastorate of the Home Mission churches at Sandy Point and Ingomar, N. S. We are confident that Mr. Inman, who is both methodical and thorough, will do well the work which has been assigned to him.

Rev. J. A. Stevens, vice-president was re-elected to the Board, so also were Rev. B. M. Hicks, secretary and Rev. J. A. Moses assistant treasurer.

We, as a Board, desire the prayers of all of God's people in order that the Home Mission Department might truly expand the Kingdom by extending the message of full salvation.
