Mr. Cochrane was at his best while speaking to the group. His subjects were, "Husband and wife in Christian marriage", "Husband and wife in the Christian home", and "Husband and wife in Christian service." He emphasized that husband and wife must love one another more than any other person, and that the husband must be the leader in the home rather than the boss. He said that family altars were most important to the happiness of the home and children must be disciplined early in life.

Sunday afternoon the group separated with Mr. Cochrane speaking to the men and Mrs. Cochrane to the ladies. These were most profitable services. Mr. Cochrane told the men if they were going to have better wives, they must be better husbands. "Thoughtfulness, and an understanding of your wife would help make a marriage successful", he said. In Mrs. Cochrane's talk to the ladies, she emphasized the need of the women praying for their husbands and showing appreciation for little acts of kindness. "Men should never come home from work to a messy home or a messy wife", she said.

During the Sunday night service Mr. Cochrane challenged the group to go back to their homes and churches to win other married couples to the Lord.
