many times; and thanks also to the members of the Alliance who so graciously approved the committee's nominations. I owe a debt of gratitude to Rev. E. W. Tokley, Associate Editor and Business Manager of the Highway during this last six-year term of my editorial service. Brother Tokley's patience, understanding, and brotherly kindness, as we have worked to-gether under rather difficult circumstances, have been a strength and an inspiration to me.

It would be altogether impossible for me to list all the names of people who have helped me in this service. They are legion. To one and all I am deeply grateful. My most fervent thanks is reserved for the One Who has been my unfailing help and stay—the Lord Himself. I must acknowledge His grace and guidance that has been unfailing. To whatever extent my service has been acceptable and beneficial, I owe praise to the God of all grace.
